Mandatory Compliance by 25 April 2022



A picture speaks more than 1000 words. Each Smart City should submit ONLY Six photographs & 2 videos, one of 30-sec and other of 90-sec duration highlighting benefits to the city of Mission projects and testimonials of users/citizens.

The best photographs will be used for Coffee Table Book, which shall be released on the day of ISAC 2022 Award Ceremony. The best videos will be shared on global platforms.

Top-10 Photographs will be rewarded



SPV can engage Professional Photographers!!

Photos submitted must be shot at 300 dpi OR at least 2400 pixels on the shorter side, and no more than 3600 pixels on the longer side (maintaining an aspect ratio (L/S) of 1.25 – 1.50). Images should be no larger than 16-24MB. Photos must be in JPEG format. File name; No longer than 50 characters

will be rewarded

Top-5 Videos will be rewarded (in both categories of 30-sec and 90-sec)



File Format: .mov or .mp4; Video Length: 30-sec & 90-sec
Landscape/horizontal videos must have an aspect ratio of 16:9 (for example, 1920 × 1080) or 4:3 (for example, 1440 × 1080).
Portrait/vertical videos must have an aspect ratio of 9:16 (for example, 1080 × 1920) or 3:4 (for example, 1080 × 1440).
File size: Up to 1GB; File name; No longer than 50 characters







What does this entail for Smart Cities?

Cities to take following actions

- Float all project tenders and issue work orders before 31 March 2022
- Accelerate project implementation, complete at least 50% projects
- Maximize fund utilization, avail remaining tranches of funds from GOI
- Maintain average monthly expenditure of more than 20 crore
- Update details in NIP, OOMF modules regularly
- Hold at least one SCAF meeting per each quarter
- Complete at least 50 internships under TULIP
- DO NOT WAIT..!! Start documenting 'completed projects' for Stage-II of ISAC 2022!!
