- Reduces the burden on public transport




CITIES WORLDWIDE ARE REINVENTING THEMSELVES

Scale up solutions to transform the city

Seville's transformation:

80km cycle network built in 18 months! (160+ km today)

Cycling increased over 1000% in 5 years (2006-11)

The cost: \$20M (just 2% of cost of an 18-km metro)

Cycling trips are twice of metro trips



11 cities shortlisted at the end of Stage 1 » Award of Rs.1 Cr each » Intensive support

Plan and implement with the community

Spread the word to get citizen support

Learn and improve through monitoring




KEY POINTS OF THE CHALLENGE BRIEF











Challenge brief

Key points to note

- The interventions can be a pan-city initiative and not limited to ABD area
- Cities to implement at least one pilot intervention in stage 1.
- Interventions implemented before July will not be considered. However, cities can build on the existing interventions at design stage.
- Cities that do not qualify in Stage 2 will be eligible to re-apply. The process will repeat multiple times to encourage other cities to embrace a cycling transformation

What support can the cities expect from MoHUA?

- Access to knowledge resources and online workshops
- Support from experts and feedback from peers
- Connect with citizens & CSOs for assistance in implementation



What knowledge resources can the cities expect?

- Design and implementation of interventions
- Collaborative planning with citizens
- Communications and outreach
- Measuring the impact



What would the city's team be?

- Identify a nodal officer and other team members
- Local CSO partners
- Interns (eg., through MoHUA's TULIP Programme)



How can citizens/CSOs support the city?

- Design & implementation
- Community participation (Eg. RWAs, SHG)
- Documentation & social media outreach
- Mobilising volunteers
- Sponsorship
