

Arterial Streets

Arterial streets provide intra-city long distance travel. They connect various parts of the city. They have high traffic volume and high vehicle speeds. They usually have public bus transport or IPT route service.

Collector Streets

Collector streets connect **traffic from local streets to arterial streets.** They also
provide connection between **different neighbourhoods within one locality.** They
may or may not have public bus transport
or IPT route service.

Local Streets

Local streets provide access to private properties in a neighbourhood. They are not meant to provide through-movement for vehicles outside the neighbourhood. As per IRC:86 the speed on local streets should be not more than 30kmph.


Create an impactful video of the city's transformation

A video is a great way to showcase your story of transformation, as it includes people and emotions in action.

- Keep your video short, under 2min. Think of it as an ad, and not a documentary.
- Show the key highlights of your 6-month long journey in the C4C Challenge.
- Use simple video making tools such as lumen5.
- The most important part of the video is the story. Tell a story that the audience can never forget!

Photos show the drastic transformation of a space, and capture the activities that make it come alive. We will use the photos for our posters, videos, and social media posts.


Ensure that the photos are:



As per our discussion had in your office, Nagpur Smart and Sustainable City Development Corporation Limited (NSSCDCL), has identified the various routes for cycling track as a pilot intervention based on the site survey carried out by NSSCDCL team and citizens response. The cycling stretch proposed is a loop as mentioned below:

Law college square - Bhole Petrol Pump-VIP road -Alankar Square -Swargiya Annabhau Sathe Chowk-NEERI road-Back to Bhole Petrol Pump- Maharaj bag Square-Akashwani Square - VCA Square - Mason Lodge Square - Japanese Garden Square - Seminary Hills (via WCL ghat road) - Vayusena Nagar - Hanuman Tekdi Road - Walker's Street - Ladies Club Square - Law College Square.


The roads in the route mentioned above have all traits-such as wide, congestion free, no onstreet parking issues, properly lit at night, etc. to have dedicated bicycle lanes. Such an initiative will promote the bicycling in the city and a new wave of green city will be seen.



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
