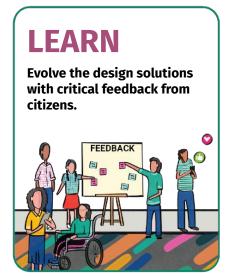

Embrace this mantra as you work towards implementing on-ground transformations!

But first, what do we mean by testing interventions?

Testing interventions
(Tactical urbanism) is an approach to neighborhood building that uses short-term, low-cost and scalable interventions to catalyze long term change.

HP Junction, Mumbai was redesigned with simple tools like traffic cones and paint for safe pedestrian movement



These are quick, temporary, innovative and low-cost interventions!



Via placemaking physical elements



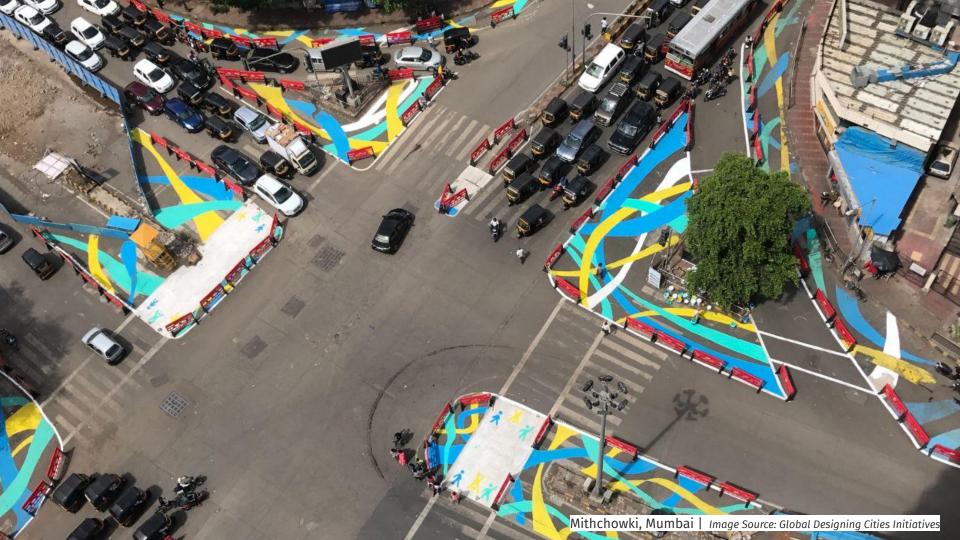
Via re-programming existing activities



By simple line-out markings



By hosting campaigns and events!



But why should we be testing interventions before making it permanent?

Here are 3 reasons why!



To check design feasibility and modify

To test what works and what doesn't work, and eliminate design mistakes, before making a permanent change on ground. With the learnings and citizen feedback, there's scope to refine and improve the design.



To gauge impact and travel behaviour



To build support with multiple groups

Here are 3 reasons why!



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To gauge impact and travel behaviour

Simple materials like paint, chalk, tapes, traffic cones, etc are readily available, low cost materials, that help understand the impact of the design faster as it is quick to implement.



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To build support with multiple groups

This allows people to physically experience a different reality and strengthens relationships with road users, stakeholders and other groups. It also helps build support with the traffic police, shopkeepers, etc.

But, have Indian Cities done this before?

ABSOLUTELY!

Indian cities have tested interventions and are continuing to do so!



Bengaluru created safe pop-up cycle lanes



Kohima created a pedestrian only street by reclaiming parking spaces, one of their many interventions!



Gurugram tested their designs on intersections to make it safe for walking & cycling



Here's a glimpse of the <u>Stage 1</u> tests conducted!



The <u>placemaking marathon</u> also witnessed many such tests on-ground!









and <u>scaling up</u> to other parts of the city!

Indian cities are also learning from their tests

before making these interventions permanent

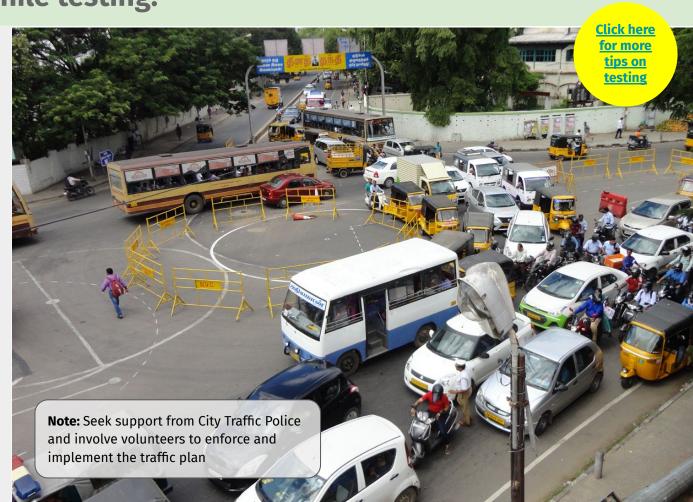
Documentation

- Document existing condition before the intervention.
- Document implementation of pilot
- Document the transformation and its impact.

DOs and DONTs while testing!

Here are some pointers to keep in mind as you test your interventions:

- Ensure that there is proper segregation while testing cycle tracks
- The entirety of cycle tracks need not be painted ensure surface is smooth to ride on
- Demarcate legible spaces for on-street parking
- Use colourful patterns for the pedestrian realm to make it attractive, but is not required for cycle lanes.
- Create a traffic management plan & use innovative materials to channelize traffic.

The Healthy Streets Policy

What is the Healthy Streets Policy?

A Policy that sets out the vision, goals, and the steps required to transform city streets into safe, attractive, and comfortable spaces.

Why adopt the Healthy Streets policy?

To sustain the momentum from the national Challenges and prioritise cycling and walking infrastructure in the city in the long-term.

C1. Institutionalise the **Open Streets Campaign**









Get started on rolling out an Open Streets Campaign, if you haven't!

How?

- Select multiple streets across your city
- 2. **Open up the streets** only for pedestrians and cyclists
- 3. **Collaborate** with local organizations to liven up the streets
- 4. Capture impact, improve, and repeat
- 5. And institutionalize Open Streets for long-term impact



In this workshop, we discussed...

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Challenge Timeline and Submission Deadlines



Progress submission requirements: October 2022











Action

- Detailed design for at least 5 km of Healthy Streets network with dedicated footpaths, protected cycle tracks, and safe intersections and/or traffic-calmed street network with segregated footpath and cycling made safe in mixed traffic
- Tested design through temporary trials and initiated permanent implementation for at least 3 km of Healthy Streets network (only projects tendered out after June 2021 will be considered)
- Launched other initiatives: Cycle training centers, Cycle repair clinics, Public Bicycle Sharing, etc.*

Foundation

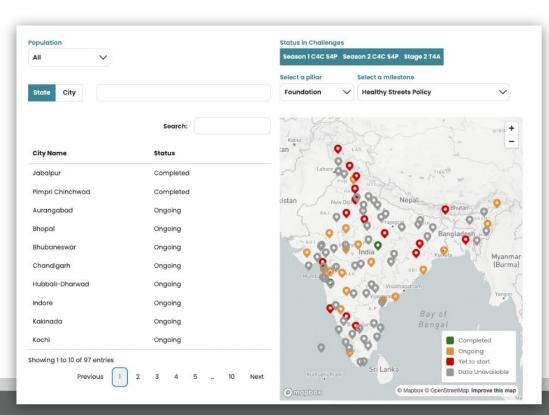
- Set up Healthy Streets Apex Committee and conducted regular meetings
- Shared the Healthy Streets Policy for Public Consultation*

Communication

- Hosted one of the following campaigns
 - Open Street Campaigns at least 5 events in 2022
 - Cycle2Work piloted the initiate
 - Mention any other campaigns
