



Assessment of Surat's cycle lanes

Presentation by Surat Municipal Corporation & Surat Smart City 20 December, 2022

Surat created 80+ km of cycle lanes in 2022



City is conducting open streets, cycle training, rallies and capacity development session to spread awareness and encourage cycling!









Red lanes have given visibility to cyclists



However, use of cycle lanes was a question, and hence Surat did a assessment to understand what needs to be improved

1. Encroachment on cycle lanes breaks the continuity

Vehicles, on-street vendors, and pedestrians obstruct the movement.

2. Certain design details made it difficult to use cycle lanes

Improper design details slow down speed, reduce safety, and create inconvenience for cyclist.







Closely spaced bollards

Sharp turns

Uneven surface

3. Visibility to cyclist was essential at the conflict points





- Intersection area is large to cross
- Some crossing links are missing
- Fear of fast moving vehicle is there

4. Constant in and out of cycle tracks discouraged cyclists



We have to improve the user experience of various cyclists





Solutions that Surat is working on...







Surat has formed a team of bicycle ambassadors



An innovative idea of adopting different stretches of 5-6 km short cycle tracks by 15 cycle ambassadors from the city has been thought of.

And they will highlight different gaps, perform different activities and campaigns for the promotion of cycling on this 5 km cycle track.

Encouraging Citizens for the maximum use of the Cycling Lanes

Surat's first priority is to bring maximum number of cyclists on cycling lanes by:

- Monthly cycling events
- Identify and develop most busy cycling routes on priority basis
- Awareness campaign and training activities
- Declare cycle track as a zero Encroachment routes
- Strict enforcement on cycling routes in morning peak hours

Surat is further planning for:

- Creating good examples of walking and cycling infrastructure & neighbourhoods by hiring design consultants
- Adopting Healthy streets and action plan
- Regular campaigns and capacity development
