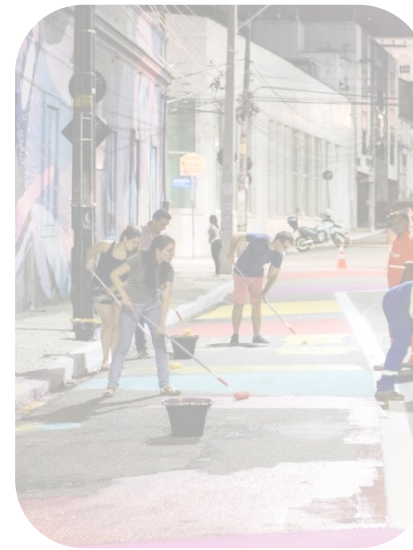

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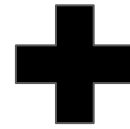

Role of Apex Committee

- Set goals, outcomes, and output indicators for the Healthy Streets Policy + Parking Policy
- Review designs of Healthy Streets projects
- Monitor Healthy Streets projects
- Ensure participatory planning

Role of the Healthy Streets Department

- Plan, design, and implement Healthy Streets projects
- Conduct capacity building workshops
- Hold stakeholder discussions
- Communicate the benefits

Healthy Streets Apex Committee

The city should set up an Apex Committee to **improve coordination between various agencies at the city** and ensure consistent engagement with all stakeholders.

Representatives from all stakeholder groups will convene regular meetings.



Municipal Commissioner (Head)

Government departments

All road owning and maintenance agencies in the city including but not limited to:



Traffic police



Public transport agencies



Development authority

Utility regulators

The committee should have key decision makers from utility agencies including, but not limited to :



Water supply



Electricity



Telephone

Experts and Civil Society Representatives

Representatives from external non-governmental agencies and academia with expertise in NMT and PT projects, civil bodies associated with street vending, women's rights, children, the disabled, etc.

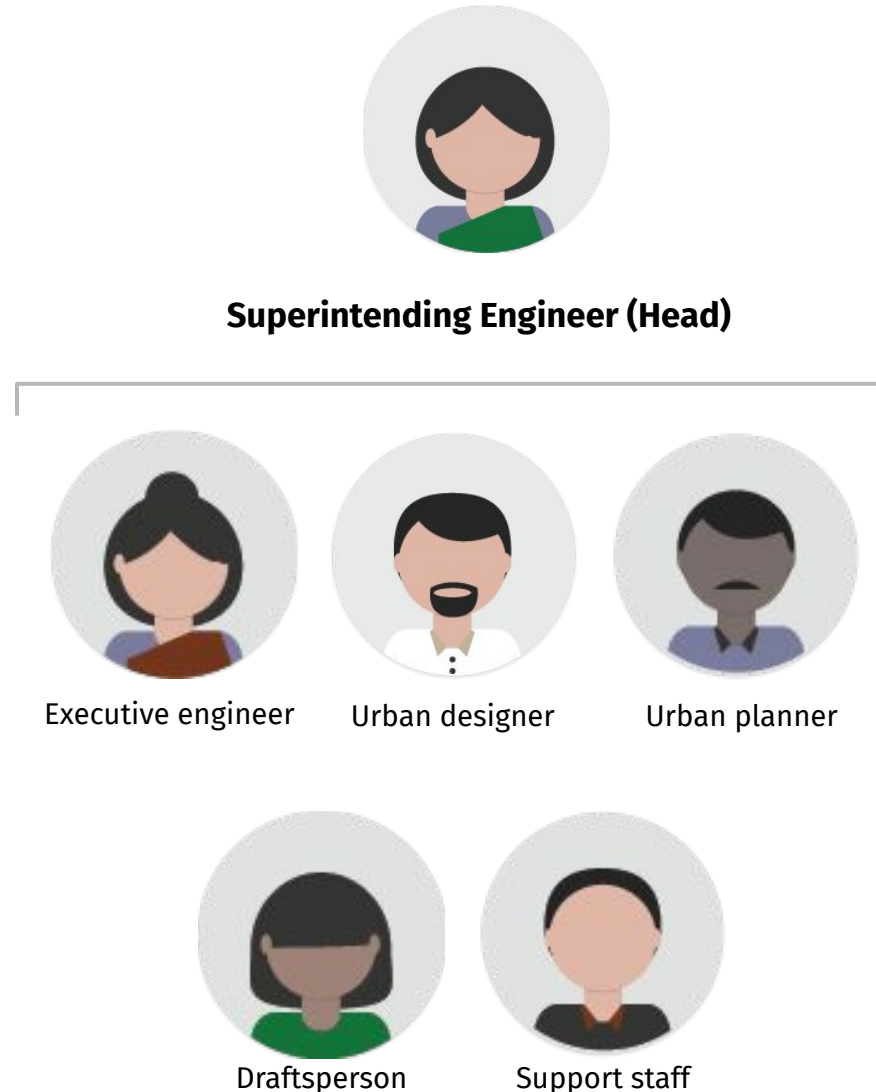
Stage 1 requirement

Healthy Streets Department

The Urban Local Body in the city should set up a dedicated **Healthy Streets Department** under the existing Road Department for -

- Planning and designing of Healthy Streets projects
- Monitoring the work by design consultants, contractors

The Department should **include dedicated internal staff**, supported by **specialised external consultants where required.**

Setting up an Healthy Streets Department

1

Prepare a Healthy Streets Department proposal -

- roles and responsibilities
- staffing requirement
- budget

2

Get approval from the standing committee / general body

3

Identify internal staff and hire additional staff to be part of the department

4

Meeting with Apex committee to discuss the priorities

5

Prepare the plan of action to achieve the Healthy Streets Goals

Develop a **planning strategy** to expand Streets for People across the city

- Based on your strategy, **identify potential locations** to scale up Streets for People
- **Expand existing pilots**

- Conduct **focused group discussions**
- Share the plan for **public consultation**
- Host **Open street campaigns** at the selected locations

Steps required for Stage 1 submissions

Engage with citizens throughout the process...

Step 1: Bring in the **learnings** from the test

Once you have tested the interventions on ground, make sure to **bring in your learnings from the:**

- Process of **selecting locations**
- Process of **designing**
- Process of **testing these designs on ground**
- Process of **engaging with the community**
- Process of **monitoring and evaluating** the interventions



We will be sharing a guide to help you capture the learnings!

Step 2: Develop your scale up strategy

To develop your city's scale-up strategy:

Refer existing data such as

- Flagship and neighbourhood locations selected, but not tested in stage 01
- Proposals under Smart Cities Mission, CMP, Master plan etc.

Host **team discussions with relevant stakeholders** such as planners, experts and traffic police.



You can develop **strategies to make safe, healthy and happy streets** across the typologies listed below:

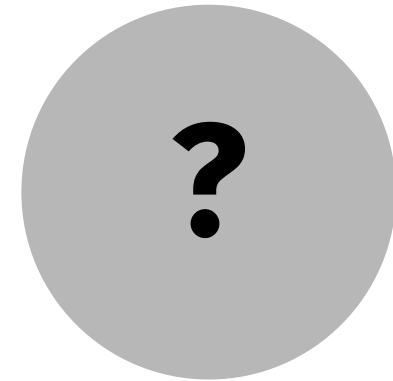

Step 3: Expand Streets for People

Cities are expected to submit a Scale up plan as a deliverable for Stage 1 - Streets for People Challenge.

- **Based on your strategy, Identify potential locations** to scale up Streets for People in your city. Cities are **encouraged to conduct an on ground recce** at potential locations to check feasibility of implementation.
- **Expand existing pilots** and make them more accessible by **walking and cycling**.



Step 4: Build support

Once the Healthy Streets plan is prepared, build support from the citizens:

- Conduct **focused group discussions** with the relevant stakeholders at the selected locations to understand their concerns
- Host **open street campaigns** at the selected locations to let the users experience Streets for People!
- Share the plan for **public consultation** and incorporate suggestions from the citizens



Throughout, keep the plan **flexible!**

Following the **TEST - LEARN - SCALE** approach,

- **Ensure to revisit the plan regularly** based on new learnings
- **Do not hesitate to update or change** the plan as you get feedback

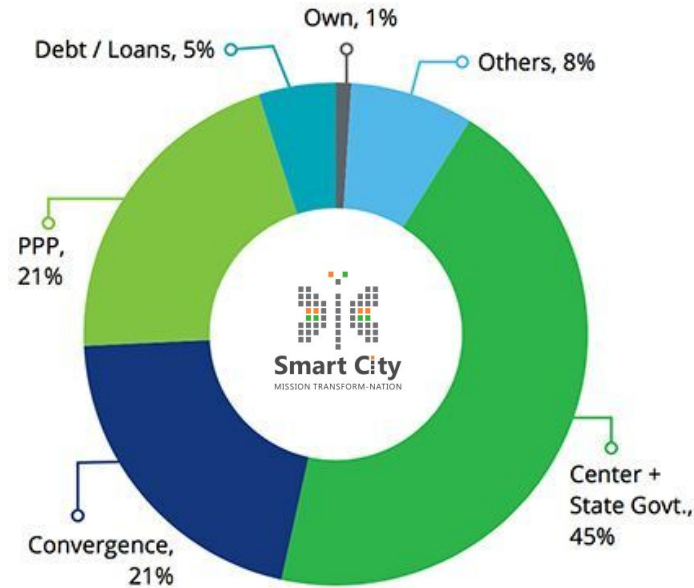
