
A good start for all children

All babies and toddlers, especially the most disadvantaged, deserve a good start in life.


A good start puts each individual child on the path to realizing their full potential and, collectively, sets the foundation for a healthy, creative and peaceful society.


Early experiences shape the brain...and the future

a. Infant representative of never-stunted growth




b. Infant representative of stunted growth











Six main challenges in cities that limit the wellbeing of ITCs.

Neighbourhoods are uniformly and overwhelmingly car-centric.

That results in the pedestrian way being full of obstacles, with overall limited safety when moving in neighborhoods.

There is frequently poor access to public facilities because of phenomena like encroachment and deterioration.

The threat of personal crime like burglary and assault is present, and women are especially vulnerable.

Little maintenance, both in the public ways and in public facilities from lack of investment.

When there is public investment, there are often misplaced priorities, such as beautification over performance in green spaces.




Busy areas are safer at all times of day


"We not too interested in sitting there personally, but at least it should look nice from our kitchen window"

ITC Mobility Chain: multiple trips, multiple caregivers




ITCs are minimum 2 people!
