EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FROM NGOs FOR CONDUCTING COMMUNITY BASED ACTIVITIES IN SLUMS UNDER SMART CITY INTERVENTIONS

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1. Introduction

Bhubaneswar has topped the list in the 'Smart City Challenge', an initiative by the Government of India to drive economic growth and improve the quality of life of people in urban areas. The Bhubaneswar Smart City plan focuses on "creating a model of sustainable urbanization based on new urbanism principles that have transformative potential to provide people with prosperity, safety and equity" The key elements of the plan are 'Area Based Development' of 985 acres of area centred on the main city known as 'Bhubaneswar Town Centre District' (BTCD) and 'Pan City Solutions' for the entire city. While the pan city solution targets at providing smart solutions through a centralized command and control center, inter-agency and inter-sectoral collaboration and urban mobility, the area based development focuses on land use planning and infrastructure development of the BTCD area.

In the process of rolling out the Smart City Plan, proactive steps are being taken by Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC), Bhubaneswar Development Authority (BDA) and Bhubaneswar Smart City Ltd (BSCL) to engage a wide range of organisations, institutions and most importantly the citizens in the entire process to achieve the specified goals of the Smart City Plan. Bhubaneswar Development Authority has partnered with United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) with the aim to develop an integrated and synergistic model for social interventions through scientific planning, and community engagement. The proposed intervention will help in achieving some of the measurable impacts outlined in the Smart City proposal like improving public service delivery through citizen-centric approach, reducing vulnerabilities, promoting social cohesion by increasing opportunities for citizen engagement, women empowerment, decreasing social inequalities and safety of citizens, especially children, women and elderly and make Bhubaneswar a Socially Smart City.

BSCL invites **Expression of Interest** (EoI) from experienced NGOs to conduct community based activities in slums in the Bhubaneswar Jurisdiction Area under the 'Smart City' interventions and the services of the selected NGO/s shall be utilized by BSCL and other authorities from time to time depending on the prioritized slum development interventions.

2. Objectives

The specific objectives of the interventions would focus to:

- a) Develop a youth-centric and youth-led integrated social intervention model to support citizens connect initiative.
- b) Promote safety and security of girls and women in Bhubaneswar with specific focus on urban slums through community partnerships.
- c) Increase availability and accessibility of social, health and other development programmes for the vulnerable and marginalized population sub groups.

3. Eligibility Criteria

- i. The Agency must have established office in Bhubaneswar city
- ii. The Agency must have at least two years experience of working in Bhubaneswar slums in the Social Sector field, namely in the areas of,
 - a) Health
 - b) Education
 - c) Sanitation
 - d) Environment
 - e) Women rights issue
 - f) Child safety, education etc.
 - g) Youth & Development
 - h) Community Volunteer programme, etc.
- iii) a) The Agency must be a Non-Government Organization (NGO) registered under relevant Acts.
 - b) Preference will be given for NGOs particularly experience of working with State/Central Govt./schemes and/or International Organizations/NGOs.
 - c) Preference will be given to NGOs, which have prior experience of working with BDA/BMC.

4. Other Conditions

I. Even if an applicant firm satisfies the above requirements, it will be subject to disqualification if it has:

- a. Made a false representation in the form, statement and attachments required in the Registration documents;
- Record of poor performance such as abandoning work, not properly completing contract, financial failures or delayed completion;
- c. If it has been convicted by any court of law.
- II. An Applicant must not have, during the last two years, failed to perform on any agreement, as evidenced by imposition of a penalty by an arbitral or judicial authority or a judicial pronouncement or arbitration award against the Applicant, nor been expelled from any project or agreement nor have had any agreement terminated for breach of contract by such Applicant.
- III. A self-declaration as a compliance of the above clause 4.1 and 4.2 shall be attached by the agency.

5. Scope of Services

The illustrative scope of services shall include as give below: (however, the detailed scope of work shall be intimated to the selected agency on issuance of work order):

I. Youth Engagement Programmes in slums of BTCD area

Task 1: Community Sensitization and Dialogue:

The selected NGO will be responsible to

- Organize sensitization programmes for youth leaders, elected representatives, community
 groups and key decision makers in the slums to inform, involve and engage them in slum
 development interventions.
- Organize sensitization programmes for NGOs/CBOs, MahilaArogyaSamitis, Women SHG
 members, front line functionaries and other stakeholders to bring them to a common
 platform and engage them through dialogues and discussions on issues related to the
 slum dwellers.
- Conduct theme based sessions such as violence against women, rights and gender equality, youth involvement and other such issues. Special sessions will be organized for young migrants to adapt to new life in the city, reduce vulnerabilities and create awareness on opportunities that would help in realizing their aspiration
- Develop/Adapt theme wise modules and other resource and communication materials to facilitate the discussions

Task 2:Formation of Youth Clubs

- Mobilize young boys and girls from identified slums to form clubs/groups
- Organize fortnightly meetings with the young boys and girls on various themes like life skills, relationships, health including SRH, gender sensitivity, gender based violence, opportunities for skill development, career counseling and financial literacy.
- Train identified young boys and girls from the slums as peer educators/leaders.

Task 3: City Changer Labs

- Organize discussion forums in the slums on issues related to the area viz: domestic violence, substance abuse, sanitation, drinking water, livelihood etc.
- Facilitate the discussions in the slums and help the people to bring out solutions to the identified issues.
- Document and disseminate the activities taken up in the slums and connect with the wider mass through various forums (social media, print and electronic media etc).

II. Empowerment and well-being of girls and women

Task 1: Sensitization of men and boys

The NGO/Agency will

 Organize sensitization sessions for men and boys of the identified slums on gender equality, domestic and sexual violence, legal provisions, rights of girls and women and gender sensitive behavior

Task 2: Orientation of frontline workers

- Orientation programmes for ANMs, ASHAs and AWWs, members of MahilaArogyaSamitis,
 WSHGs and other frontline workers on safety, security and well being of girls and women in the slums
- Facilitate linkages services for health, women and child development, police and legal aid and government programmes and schemes.
- Develop/Adapt theme wise modules and other resource and communication materials to facilitate the discussions

Task 3: Convergence with line departments

- Convergence and linkages to strengthen sexual and reproductive health services in the slums of Bhubaneswar city
- Convergence and linkages to promote skill development, vocational education and other developmental programmes in the slums
- Identify and enlist drop out girls (and boys) from the slums who could benefit from skills development programmes.
- Link the potential candidates to vocational and skills development trainings organized by various government and private agencies.
- Build linkages and convergence with other sectors to strengthen programmes to improve reach of ongoing social development initiatives.
- Strategically work with BDA/BMC and government departments to leverage and strengthen on-going programmes and schemes to ensure synergy.

III. Research and Documentation

Task 1: Conduct Survey and community mapping exercises

- Support BSCL in identifying vulnerable pockets in the slums, mapping the basic amenities available in the identified slums.
- Conduct the community surveys through involvement of the community by engaging slum level CBO's.
- Support BSCL in conducting socio-economic and other community surveys, if required.
- To promote convergence with other city wide schemes supported by other development schemes, programmes and missions if required.
- To collate and ensure that the data collected at the slum level is ratified by the CBOs
 /community structures before finalization of data at the BSCL level for further analysis.
- To provide inputs and support in categorizing and classification of slums based on the socio-economic data, spatial data as per the GIS manual / guidelines and the planning guidelines.
- To ensure community participation through slum based NGOs/CBOs in the adoption of choices for development models in the case of re-location and up gradation of slums.

Task 2: Documentation and Dissemination

- Documentation of case studies, good practices, lessons learnt.
- Preparation of IEC Materials such as Leaflets, Posters, Banners.
- Document strategies and interventions for dissemination and possible replication in other similar milieus and population groups.
- Facilitate in organizing workshops, meetings and other discussion forums.

The Agency shall have credibility to ensure community participation and capacity to articulate the slum dwellers' interests sensitively. It is required to support the BSCL in ratification of survey data by the community structure / CBO's and in developing the framework for slum development. It is also expected to conduct surveys, social audits, concurrent evaluations to ensure rigorous monitoring and evaluation at each stage of intervention.

6. Geography / Area of Work

The proposed interventions will be carried out in Bhubaneswar Town Centre District (BTCD)with focus on slums specified under Bhubaneswar Smart City Plan. The other slums may be taken up as necessary.

7. Funding:

The Budget to the selected NGO will be Rs 9,90,924 (approx.), inclusive of taxes, for a period of one year. The funding will be as per the actual deployment of the Project team. The NGO expenses include the Project Manager, two Field Coordinators, Programme management expenses, One time support costs, NGO Administrative expenses.

8. Project Duration:

The duration of the Project is for a period of one year. However, the project period may be extended subject to performance and availability of funding.

9. Project team:

The Project Team shall consist of the following:

i. Project Manager: He/She will be paid an honorarium of Rs 30,000 per month

ii. Field Coordinators: Two coordinators will be paid Rs 14,000 as honorarium and Rs 1000 for travel each.

The project team will be provided programme management expenses of Rs 5,600 per month.

The proposed Project team will have to be present at the time of the evaluation by the Technical Committee.

10. Evaluation Criteria

The submitted proposals will be evaluated by a Technical Committee based on the experience, team composition and approach and methodology towards implementation of the project. The Committee will prepare a shortlist of the NGOs that will be invited for a power point presentation of 15 minutes duration regarding their approach and methodology for the project. The NGO authorized person along with the proposed Project team will have to be present during the Technical Evaluation. Based on the evaluation criteria below, marks will be awarded by the Committee.

The NGO that achieves the highest marks will be awarded the work.
