



1. Stakeholder Engagement (SCAF Meetings)



City should have conducted at least two meetings of Smart Cities Advisory Forum during last four quarters (15 Aug 2019 – 30 Sep 2020) and the Minutes of Meetings (MoM) submitted to the Ministry





A picture speaks more than 1000 words. The 'Building Cities for people – Photograph/Video Campaign' should represent Citizen Engagement in true spirit. Each Smart City should submit at least six photographs & two audio-visuals of 30-sec & 90-sec duration highlighting the benefits, that Smart Cities Mission projects are providing to citizens.


Focus of photographs has to be on depicting benefits being drawn by citizens because of Smart Cities Mission and could include citizen testimonials/ citizen feedback sessions created under Smart Cities Mission. Workshops/Press clipping photographs will not be allowed.

The best photographs on first come first serve will be used for Coffee Table Book which will be released on the day of ISAC 2020 Award Ceremony.

The Building Cities for People – Photographs/Video campaign should encapsulate work done by Smart Cities through audio-visuals and photographs, meeting desired quality standards.

ISAC 2020 Mandatory Compliance:

City should submit prescribed number of quality Photographs/ Audio Visuals latest by 15 September 2020 for eligibility to ISAC 2020







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

Specifications for Photographs/ Audio-visuals

Since the citizen is key to the Smart Cities Mission, our visual representation should focus on the citizen enjoying the benefits of a smarter city – in every sense. A few guidelines:

Ensure that the photographs are in high resolution - not less than 300 dpi (or 1500 pixels x 900 pixels) in JPEG/TIFF format.

For real life people (like citizens), shoot in natural daylight as much as possible. Focus on capturing candid activities with happy / satisfied facial expressions.

Ensure well-thought out composition with the right elements captured in the photographs that you wish to highlight. Avoid third part elements (eg., some person's hand or half cut face, a person's back in the foreground of the picture, distracting objects, etc.).

Shoot in natural light as much as possible, using a digital SLR camera. If not available, then a top-quality camera phone with the photo quality setting at maximum.

Title every picture submitted with activity and city name.
